

The diving portion of the **VIth World Masters Games** was held at the Kinsman Sports Center, Edmonton, Alberta, Canada, July 25-28 2005. Hosted by the Alberta Diving Association. Meet Director-Barbara Bush Dauphinais; Referee and Head Judge-Taunya Haley; Meet Manager-Steve Flewwelling. There were two formats: **(1) FINA Mod. A** (Munich/Melbourne) for regular divers, and **(2) Modified FINA** (reduced) for novices. 110 divers registered; 99 divers participated. There were some close contests, and due to the “uncontrolled exuberance” of the judging, especially in the older age groups, many new records were set.

[Notes: 1. From 2000 forward, the tower events were held in 5-year age groups throughout, even though the 1998-2000 Rule Book did not have 5 year age groups beginning until 60+.

2. As of March 2002, The FINA Masters dive format was completely changed. Therefore, a new record section was implemented in 2004 reflecting this change (Riccione format.) For the 2005 World Masters Games and this event only, there was a **FINA Modified A List**, which essentially was the old format used in Munich/Melbourne, for more advanced divers. The **Modified FINA List**, which was a reduced list was for novices (similar to the **Melbourne B List**), and differed from the Riccione format, which is the current FINA format for Masters competition (which we hope will be changed in 2006.)

3. In as much as the World Masters Games is not an official FINA event, is held every four years, and this year was entry-restricted, whatever records were set will stand as WMG records and not official FINA records. They will be included separately in the Records section as appropriate.

4. The next **World Masters Games** will be held in Sydney, Australia in 2009. The **XI FINA World Masters Aquatic Championships** will be held August 4-17, 2006 at Stanford, California.]
